

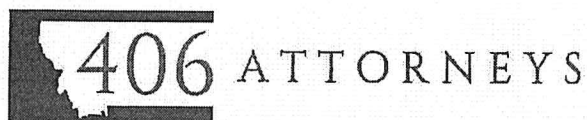



Dear Governor Gianforte and Advisory Counsel Members:

I have known David Grubich professionally for a decade and have had the opportunity to see his work both as a practicing attorney and as the Eighth Judicial District's Standing Master for the past several years.

Often, in selecting a judge for appointment, there is a measure of uncertainty as to how the applicant, regardless of qualifications, will adjust to and perform on the bench. With Judge Grubich, we are fortunate to have already seen his performance. And I can unequivocally say, as someone who has spent significant time in the courtroom both as an attorney and on the bench assisting sitting judges as a substitute judge, standing master, and judge pro tem, that Judge Grubich is an outstanding judge. He possesses all of the qualities that are desirable in a district court judge and none of the qualities which are undesirable. The Eighth Judicial District would be well served by his appointment.

Judge Grubich is a detailed and skilled legal analyst. He has a broad range of knowledge of the law and the judicial system. He has the ability to identify and analyze complex legal issues, find and apply relevant statutory and precedential authority, hear and understand nuanced arguments of counsel, make reliable credibility determinations, and synthesize facts, arguments, and law into reasoned and just decisions.

And because he is a nimble thinker with good analytical skills, Judge Grubich can and does make solid decisions from the bench when necessary. He is decisive. In a very busy district like the Eighth Judicial District, which has less judges than recommended, the overcrowded docket needs judges like David Grubich who are able to reach fair and considered determinations in the courtroom, rather than those who require hours of contemplation and study in chambers on each case.

In addition, Judge Grubich manifests the preferred temperament for the bench. He is courteous to attorneys, parties, court staff, and witnesses. He is cool under pressure, and has a calm, steady demeanor, avoiding excessive and inappropriate emotions such as anger and frustration. He is neither too formal nor too informal. His professional demeanor garners respect. He maintains the authority and dignity of the Court without harshness or self-importance. He comes across as professional, friendly, and competent. This inspires confidence in those appearing before him.


I know that when I appear before Judge Grubich, my client's case will be decided on the facts and law of that particular case, and that the decision, for or against me, will be considered, fair, and just. That's what I want from a district court judge.

I have no idea of what Judge Grubich's politics are. He is not a public figure. He is not a controversial figure. He comes without the baggage and background that would mar public opinion of his impartiality. That is as it should be. He is quietly competent and impartial. No one appearing before him need worry that factors extraneous to the case like their or the judge's political beliefs, religious beliefs, social connections, or anything else will affect his determinations.

It is my opinion that, due to the politicized nature of the judicial appointment process in recent years in Cascade County, Judge Grubich was not given full and fair consideration in the last process, and I hope that he receives it here. I believe that he was then and is now the most qualified applicant and deserves the nomination. And the Eighth Judicial District deserves to have him in the role of District Court Judge.







I am confident that if you speak with any attorneys in Cascade County, all will confirm that


he is a knowledgeable, pleasant, hard-working standing master. There is every reason to believe this will continue if he is appointed as district judge.



I submit this letter in support of David Grubich for appointment as Eight Judicial District Court Judge. I have practiced law in Cascade County for over twenty-five years. I am a solo practitioner, and I opened Rossberg Law Office, LLC in July of 2000.

I have known David Grubich for over twenty-five years. David's wife, Valerie Grubich, and I have been friends since we met in kindergarten at Longfellow Elementary School in 1974.

David conducts his personal and family life in a manner that is above reproach. I admire his tireless commitment to his wife, young son, and even Valerie's mother. David assists in helping his mother-in-law, such as taking her to doctor and other needed appointments. David recognizes the importance of family. I unequivocally endorse Judge David Grubich for appointment to the judicial vacancy in Cascade County and this letter is in support of his appointment.

My name is Donna Gass and I am the office administrator at the Cascade County Law Clinic (CCLC). The CCLC is a small non-profit located in Great Falls, Montana. Our mission is finding pro bono attorneys for low-income individuals in family law and tenant/landlord issues.

My interactions with Judge Grubich include his previous role as board member with the CCLC and as the current Standing Master in Cascade County District Court. CCLC could always count on Judge Grubich to accept a pro bono client. When Judge Grubich became the Standing Master, I continue to observe his legal knowledge, empathy towards pro se litigants and continued efforts to improve the courts.

Judge Grubich, William Bronson, (CCLC Executive Director) and I are collaborating on a Parenting Orientation Forum for the Eighth Judicial District. The Parenting Orientation Forum is a court ordered program that applies to people who file parenting plans or guardianships. Judge Grubich volunteered and became the liaison between our committee and the judges. He presented our proposal, outline and handouts to the other judges. He proofed all the paperwork and he inserted the different judges' opinions and thoughts. Without Judge Grubich bringing together many different people's opinions and wishes, this program could not have moved forward. He worked efficiently with all personalities and opinions to make this program a reality in our court district in the future.

Family law issues are always acrimonious. Judge Grubich recently presided at a hearing for one of our clients, who appeared *pro se*. The action was a parenting plan modification, possibly resulting in immediately relocating a child out of state. After the hearing, the client reported the Judge's thoughtfulness. He declined to issue an Order from the bench, easing all parties' concerns for immediate removal of the child. Judge Grubich considered the best interests of the child. He possesses the commonsense approach to administering the law.

Judge Grubich is an outstanding example of what all *pro se litigants* think a good judge should be.

Our clients at CCLC are *pro se* litigants until they are given a pro bono attorney. Our clients are extremely fearful/ anxious about going to court without legal representation. CCLC clients believe a judge is going to take their child away, throw them in jail, or they will upset the court by being inexperienced. Judge Grubich is understanding, fair, and nonjudgmental to all CCLC *pro se* litigants. Clients have commented to his fairness and kindness even if the outcome may have not been in their favor.

After a hearing date, one client said: "[Judge Grubich] was fair, kind, understanding, empathetic, and spoke so I could understand what was happening."

The fallout from Covid-19 and one less District Court Judge has left the courts extremely back-logged. Judge Grubich, having only a part time judicial assistant and no law clerk, has helped by accepting a variety of cases with diverse legal issues that expand beyond family law. Judge Grubich runs his courtroom extremely efficiently and resolves long standing matters which lets people get back to their lives.

I strongly encourage you to consider Judge David Grubich for the next Eighth Judicial District Court Judge position. To those of us who are outside the legal community, Judge Grubich has been a wonderful example of what we think a Judge should be: kind, compassionate, empathetic, and knows the law. The people of Cascade County deserve a Judge who can be up and running. Judge Grubich could easily transition from a Standing Master to a District Court Judge.



To the Judicial Nomination Commission:

My name is Trevor Carlson, and I have been practicing law in Central Montana since 2013. I have a solo practice in Great Falls, Montana, that provides services for criminal defense, family law, landlord-tenant law, and civil litigation. I routinely appear in about a dozen counties around the area.

I have had the pleasure of appearing before Standing Master David J. Grubich since his appointment in August of 2018. In my practice of family law, I have appeared before him on several dissolution and parenting plan proceedings. I have also appeared before him on uncontested adoptions and guardianship/conservatorship proceedings. He has become one of my favorite judges to practice in front of, and I trust he would make an excellent District Court Judge.

I believe that a judge should have three qualities: 1) an ability to accurately and fairly interpret and apply the law; 2) an excellent work ethic; and 3) the proper temperament. Standing Master Grubich has all of these qualities, which is why I am writing this letter in support of his appointment.

In my cases, Standing Master Grubich has issued several orders over the last two years. His decisions have always been well-reasoned and in accordance with Montana statutes and case law. In trial, his rulings on evidentiary issues have been similarly sound. While

I have not always agreed with his rulings, I cannot say that they were wrong, and I have never felt a strong urge to seek an appeal after my cases have concluded before him.

I appreciate this adherence to black-letter law, as it brings predictability to the bench and helps me manage client expectations before going to court. It also saves my clients money by not having to appeal erroneous rulings. In reviewing his application for the Eighth Judicial District Court Judge position, I was not surprised to see he graduated from law school with honors, as he has consistently shown the intellect required for both academic performance and proper interpretation and application of the law.

Both my clients and I are grateful for Standing Master Grubich's work ethic and turnaround time on decisions. It is important for our legal system and society at large for citizens to feel they have been treated fairly and afforded their "day in court," or what we lawyers call "due process." It is not easy to explain to your clients – many of whom have little or no experience with the legal system – why a judge will "only" afford them a few hours for issues so near and dear to their hearts such as parenting time or property distribution. These are issues that will affect the client and those they love for years to come, and it is important for the integrity of our legal system that litigants feel their cases were afforded a proportionate consideration for what is at stake.

Standing Master Grubich has always accommodated my clients' requests for lengthy hearings, and in cases that unexpectedly exceeded their allotment, he has patiently allowed the parties to present their full witness testimony, evidence and arguments. He has always been attentive and interested in each piece of testimony and evidence presented. I can recall a hearing last summer that ran until 6:00 p.m. Both my client and I were grateful to have the time to present our case properly and fully to the Court.

When it comes to issuing written decisions, Standing Master Grubich has a very swift turnaround time. I know that it is not easy condensing hours of testimony into findings of fact and conclusions of law on top of an already full trial caseload. I have never asked him directly, but I suspect that Standing Master Grubich probably works nights and weekends to keep up with the litany of contested hearings that a Standing Master is assigned. He does not leave the parties wondering and waiting for the outcomes of their cases (and, in many family law cases, the outcomes of their lives) for weeks or even months on end.

In reading his application for this position, I was once again not surprised that he describes a lengthy history of public service, pro bono work, and a desire to improve the community through the legal system. I can tell you from my own observations that he personifies the devotion to public service that is described in his application.

Finally, it is my opinion that Standing Master Grubich has the proper temperament for a District Court Judge. I have witnessed him deal with unruly litigants, both *pro se* and represented, and at times, unruly attorneys as well. During these incidents, I have never seen him lose his temper. Instead, he maintains his composure in a very professional manner befitting of a judge. His courtroom demeanor is firm, yet equable, and he is a pleasure to practice in front of.

I hope this letter helps you in your decision for the next Eighth Judicial District Court Judge. I strongly believe that Standing Master David J. Grubich would be an excellent addition to the bench here in Cascade County.

Dear Judicial Nomination Commission:

I am writing this letter in support for David Grubich for the 8th Judicial District Court Judge. The Cascade County community has a long history of having independent district court judges that possessed the right temperament, value and integrity so the rule of law was respected in an ever-changing legal environment. David Grubich will be able to continue that legacy.

I had the pleasure to write to this Commission two years ago regarding the Hon. Kaydee Snipes-Ruiz in the 12th Judicial District Court. I currently work at the Montana State Office of Public Defender, Region 3, in Great Falls, Montana as an attorney. I represent clients in felony criminal cases, dependent neglect cases, juvenile and involuntary commitment cases in the 8th Judicial District Court. As a practicing attorney in 8th Judicial District Court, I feel I have an obligation to write this even if it has negative repercussions on my practice because of the importance this position has.

Why in support of David Grubich:

I have had the pleasure of practicing in front of David Grubich in his capacity as the Standing Master for the 8th Judicial District Court. I have always been impressed with Standing Master Grubich's judicial temperament. Standing Master Grubich never gets too high or too low with the parties. He does not let prejudice, passion or anger rule his thought process. Standing Master Grubich takes the facts and the rule of law to decide his decisions. I will admit that the first time practicing in front of Standing Master Grubich during an initial appearance, I was skeptical that his previous experience with law enforcement would slant his thinking and not give my client a fair shake. I found the opposite to be true. I have personally witnessed him treat attorneys on both sides of a case with respect. If he is chosen for the position, I know he would carry that same mentality as a district court judge.

Standing Master Grubich truly understands the Cascade County community. His experience handling family law and dependent neglect cases is going to be a real benefit in those caseloads. As this Commission is probably aware that Cascade County has one of the highest filings per capita of dependent neglect cases in the State of Montana. Those cases typically have families that face systematic barriers to achieve an amicable resolution. Standing Master Grubich is the person that already has a pulse on the hurdles Cascade County families face.

Standing Master Grubich also has the requisite experience to handle the Cascade County civil litigation case load that often gets puts on the back burner. Standing Master Grubich will not ignore these cases and will be able to effectively handle complex civil litigation. His years of experience working at Ugrin, Alexander and Zadick, P.C. gave him a wealth of experience of handling broad array of civil litigation issues. I have the utmost confidence he will be able to handle these types of cases as judge.

The other real benefit to Standing Master Grubich being the district court judge is that he already regularly assists the other district court judges and appears to have a good working relationship with all of them. 
Judicial candidates that give me pause:

Nothing is more frustrating for me as an attorney when it has felt judges are not being even handed in their rulings. It is frustrating when judges appear to have obvious bias. It is frustrating when a judge does not truly understand my client's socio-economic struggles. I believe the committee should consider staying away from candidates that have been career prosecutors or became prosecutors for political reasons. Not only does it cause a huge pause on the criminal calendar because the conflict of interests, but it can give an appearance of impropriety. I believe it to be a better choice for the Governor to stay away from that and go with someone more even handed.

Concluding Remarks:
